## TASK 1: <u>Catcher</u> Constructed Responses due WEDNESDAY 4/1 at 4PM (COMPLETE on SEPARATE GOOGLE CLASSROOM ASSIGNMENT!)

\*FULL sentences REQUIRED, but evidence CAN be in your own words\*

**QUESTION 1**: Throughout <u>The Catcher in the Rye</u> by J.D. Salinger, symbols and motifs are used to represent Holden's desires, fears, and character traits. In a **well-constructed response**, <u>analyze</u> which <u>2</u> <u>symbols</u> are the <u>most important</u> to understanding Holden throughout the **entire novel**. (Be sure not only to state *what* the symbol means but *WHY* they possess each meaning. Do your best to include CONTEXT.)

QUESTION 2: Past events can affect, positively or negatively, the present actions and attitudes of a character. Consider how Holden must deal with different aspects of his past. Examine how Holden's
past experiences contribute to what he experiences and how he acts in the novel. Provide at least two specific examples to support your response.

QUESTION 3: It seems as if Holden is searching for something throughout the novel. Some might argue that he is trying to find comfort and love from others. Using at least two specific examples from the text (paraphrase), state and defend your view of what Holden is searching for and what might have given him true peace and comfort in the story.

BONUS: The themes of <u>real vs. fake (phony)</u> and <u>reality vs. dreams/illusions</u> have been present in many of the texts that we have read this year: <u>The Great Gatsby</u> , "The Necklace," and <u>The Catcher in the Rye</u> . <u>Compare</u> and <u>contrast</u> how these themes have been developed in each text. Provide <u>at least four specific examples</u> .

TASK 2: Topic Brainstorm (due FRIDAY 4/3 at 4PM)
(COMPLETE on SEPARATE GOOGLE CLASSROOM ASSIGNMENT!)
Directions: We are beginning to prepare for an essay in which you will answer the following prompt: What are the root causes of Holden's behavior? (In other words, why does he act the way he does?). In order to prepare, fill in the chart below examining various parts of Holden, how he acts, and what he values. Because this is a brainstorm/topic exploration, bullet points ARE acceptable. Don't worry about answering every guiding question; instead, try to give at least 2-3 bullet points per topic.
1. Holden's Desire to be Unique (Refusal to Conform): How is Holden unique? Why does Holden want to be unique? In what ways does Holden conform? How does Holden think about other people who conform?
